Eminent Aloysian Alumni Awards 2022

Six achievers from different fields were conferred the 'Eminent Aloysian Alumni Awards' at L F Rasquinha Hall, St Aloysius College (Autonomous) on 12 January, 2022 by the management of St Aloysius Institutions and St Aloysius College Alumni Association (SACAA).

A total of 39 eminent Aloysians have been honoured since the inception of the award, including Dr N. Vinaya Hegde, Justice Santosh Hegde, Padma Bhushan K.K.



Venu Gopal – the Solicitor General of India, Padma Bhushan K.V. Kamath who was the chairman of BRICS Bank. The Government of India has recently appointed him as the Chairperson of the National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development (NaBFID).

The award program was initiated by Rev. Fr Denzil Lobo then Principal and later Rector of the college in the year 2008- and since then SACAA has been honouring the greatest achievers of this Institution. An organising committee comprised of the Rector, Heads of St Aloysius Institutions, and SACAA office bearers oversee and direct the award programme.

This year the organizing committee with the help of the Jury had chosen six more eminent Aloysians.

Mr Mavila Vishwanathan Nair is the Non-Executive Chairman of the Trans Union CIBIL, India's largest credit bureau and also the Non-Executive Chairman of KFINTECH Pvt Ltd, a leading Registrar and Transfer Agent.

Dr L.C. Soans is a renowned practitioner of organic farming in Moodubidri. He is also a recipient of Karnataka Rajyotsava Award -2016

Mr Jeeth Milan Roche is an accomplished entrepreneur and renowned environmentalist. He is the founder of Mangalore Green Brigade and has been on a mission to make Mangalore a green city.

Lt. General (Rtd) Ravi Eipe fought in the 1962 China war at battle of Namkachu as a 22 year old Captain. He took part in "Operation Pawan" in Sri Lanka for which he was awarded "Ati Vishist Seva Medal" in 1989 and was awarded "Param Vishist Seva Medal" in 1997.

Prof. Edmund J B Frank has donned various managerial positions of some of the top notch business organizations. He lives the true vision and mission of the College, being a person for and with others involving in several philanthropic and charity ventures.

Dr. Cletus J M D'Souza is a renowned Professor of Biochemistry known for his erudition and superior research credentials. He has established himself as one of the most sought after mentor and research guide in the field of Biochemistry.

The Awards ceremony began with the lighting of the lamp by dignitaries on the dais namely Rev. Fr Melwin J Pinto SJ, Rector of St Aloysius Institutions; Rev. Dr.

The alumni of the College are celebrating their Golden Jubilee Reunion and graduation by presenting such a gift to their Alma mater.

The Golden Batch students were escorted by the NCC cadets of Army, Air Wing and Navy Wing after which a unique Golden Batch Flag was hoisted by Walter D'Souza, the Chairman of the Golden Batch Reunion.

BCom D compered the program, Mr Avinash proposed the Vote of Thanks. The guest talk was organised by Ms Carrel Sharel Pereira.



National webinar on "Vaccine Development: Challenges & Opportunities"

A National webinar on "Vaccine Development: Challenges & Opportunities" was organized by the Department of PG studies and Research in Biochemistry, St Aloysius College (Autonomous) on January 24, 2022 via Zoom. Dr. Aparna Chaudhari, Principal Scientist & Head, Fish Genetics & Biotechnology Division, CIFE – Mumbai and Dr. Mahesh Prasad AJ, School of Life Sci-



ences, Pooja Bhagavat Memorial Mahajana PG Centre, Mysore were the invited speakers for the session.

The main objective of the webinar was to familiarise the participants with the development of vaccines, challenges associated with vaccine development, and the future prospects of vaccine research.

Dr. Aparna's talk primarily focused

on DNA vaccines in the aquaculture field, as a costeffective and efficient technique of managing viral infections that have a significant impact on productivity. She and her team is particularly interested in the presence of the RNA interference (RNAi) pathway in shrimp, which offers a promising new immunisation strategy. Protection against viral infections has been demonstrated using the design, manufacture, and considerations for plasmid DNA vaccines that express short or long doublestranded RNA in vivo. She highlighted the use of stable and cost-effective DNA vaccines for RNA interference to silence genes of the White Spot Syndrome Virus (WSSV) in Penaeus monodon. Silencing constructs, according to her research, can be an effective preventive technique in commercial shrimp hatcheries for protecting high-value brooders and preventing

Dr. Mahesh Prasad discussed the developing COVID-19 pandemic and the need for the creation of safe, effective, and fast-acting vaccinations to stop SARS-CoV-2 from spreading uncontrollably. He discussed the efficiency of live-attenuated yellow fever 17D (YF17D) vaccines as a vector for expressing the SARS-CoV-2 Spike antigen in its prefusion form. In mice and hamsters, the vaccine candidate YF-S0 elicits large levels of SARS-CoV-2 neutralizing antibodies and a favorable Th1 cell-mediated immunological response. He wrapped off the presentation by highlighting YF-S0 as a promising SARS-CoV-2 vaccine candidate.

Benefit in terms of learning/Skill/Knowledge obtained: More than 125 entries were received from various colleges all over India, mainly from students, research scholars and faculty. The feedback received from the participants was quite optimistic and motivating.
