

St Aloysius College (Autonomous) secures A++ Grade from NAAC in IV Cycle

St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru underwent IV Cycle NAAC Accreditation on January 16 and January 17 under the chairmanship of Prof. Anand Kumar Tyagi, Vice-chancellor Mahatma Gandhi Kashi

The College feels proud to announce that it has been accredited with a CGPA of 3.67 on a Four Point Scale at A++ Grade in the IV Cycle from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council, which is valid for a period of seven years from January 24, 2023.



Earlier, the College was assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and secured 'A' Grades in I and II Cycle in the year 2004 and 2009 respectively. In the III Cycle, the College secured 'A' Grade with CGPA 3.62 out of 4 in 2015.

India but across the globe. Despite its status as a minority institution, the College has imparted high quality education to all sections of society regardless of caste, colour or creed. The motto of the college, "Lucet et Ardet" which means "Shine to Enkindle" has inspired countless students to become men and women for and with others and thus bring light and joy into the lives of people. It is for this reason that Jesuit education has become a touchstone for evolving new paradigms in higher education. Continuing the legacy, St Aloysius College became the first institution in the coastal region to completely go online for admissions since 2017. It has launched many new and innovative undergraduate and postgraduate programmes from 2022-23. The curriculum has been designed to suit the aspirations of the New Education Policy with a multidisciplinary approach and driven by skill acquisition for employment prospects including project and internship based learning outcomes.



Besides this, 20 PG Departments of the College have been recognized as Research Centres for PhD Programmes under Mangalore University.

In the NIRF-2021 Ranking awarded by the MHRD, the College has been ranked 95 among the Colleges in India, featured in the top 3 colleges of Karnataka. Over 6000 institutions across India participated in this assessment. The College is ranked within the band of 100-150 among colleges in the Country in 2020.

The College was awarded "College with Potential for Excellence" by UGC in the year 2009 which helped in upgrading the Science laboratories and providing state-of-the-art infrastructural facilities for research. The College was also awarded the "Star College Scheme" by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India in 2012 and was upgraded to "College with Star Status" in 2016.

Lecture Series: "The Art of Memory and American Culture During the 19th Century"

The Department of Political Science at St Aloysius College (Autonomous) Mangaluru organised the SUNY Cortland Visiting Scholars Lecture Series of which Prof. Kevin B. Sheets, Department of History at the State University of New York (SUNY), Cortland addressed the B.A. Political Science students and faculty on, "The Art of Memory and American Culture During the 19th Centu-



ry". Prof. Sheets has been passionately pursuing projects in American cultural history largely relating to the importance of memory to 19th and 20th century American culture. As part of this, he has been investigating memory training systems which proliferated in the 19th century providing a window onto Americans' understanding of the mind's workings and the cultural significance of knowledge accumulation and use. The talk by Prof. Sheets addressed as to how memory was designed and promoted in 19th century America as a cultural phenomenon.

Prof. Sheets drew comparison between 19th century memory systems in the USA with the present. Contemporary memory books and manuals cater to societal anxiety. However, in the 19th century America, memory be-



came associated with classical cultural literacy. Poems written by Virgil or Ovid in Latin would require one to have keen memory. Secondly, education demanded that one knew a language such as Latin to enrol into the college and to graduate. The other important role that memory played was in terms of 'furnishing the mind' which was one of the goals of education. The mind is considered as an empty room, and furnishing one's mind

with knowledge, language skills, to quote vignettes from one's travel etc. made the art of memory pertinent. By developing memory systems, the pedagogical purposes were served. Moreover, memory systems were developed to earn respectability in society and to have improved conversational skills. Over a period of time, the market for memory appeared with a ready and willing audience especially among salespersons.

Memory systems depend on two important principles—locality and association. Here, memory anchors play an important role in recalling a memory that is stored in one's mind. Prof. Sheets gave a glimpse of how the earlier forms of memory systems were developed, some of which were absurd and difficult in understanding. The latter ones ensured that they distinguished their systems as efficient, easy or organised. Memory played an important role as knowledge was considered valuable to be accepted or to be introduced into the genteel world.

The Q&A involved questions that ranged from personal to topical. Students enquired on when and why Prof. Sheets got interested in the study of memory and mnemonics, whether memories of people were same, did memory systems contribute to the 19th century industrialisation in the USA etc.

The Coordinator of the Lecture Series Dr Rose Veera D'Souza, HOD Dept. of Political Science welcomed the gathering. Dr Denis Fernandes, Director of Arrupe Block, representing the Principal Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ, and Dr Charles V. Furtado, Director of Admin Block graced the occasion. MCA, MSc (ST), MSc (BD), MSc (BI), MSc (DS) Departments, AIMIT

November 30 and December 01, 2022: As part of the academic interaction with the industries, the students of M.Sc. Software Technology and Big Data Analytics (2021-2023 batch) went on a two-day industry visit to a few IT companies in Bangalore. The students were accompanied by Dr S. Ruban (HOD, Software Technology), Mr Srinivas and Mrs Anushree Raj (IT Department), AIMIT, St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru. On the first day, the students visited four companies: CloudZenix, Niramai Health Analytix followed by Pathcom Technologies and TCS Big Data Lab at St Joseph's University (SJU).

At CloudZenix, a firm that provides cloud based solutions, students were updated on various aspects of IT product development, consultation and managed service. The session was addressed by Mr Raunaak Mitra, Ms Kirti and other professionals from CloudZenix.

The next stop was on Niramai Health Analytix, Bangalore, that has developed a non-invasive method of detecting breast cancer and is ranked as one of the most innovative start-ups in the country. The session was addressed by Mr Himanshu. He spoke about their technologies, how they function, and the benefits they have over traditional technology. He also claimed that their technique can reduce costs to one-tenth of the available technologies and also discussed how their technology works, how the data was acquired and the research process they go through. He also clarified how AI and ML had a part in constructing their technology.

At Pathcom Technologies, Bangalore, which offers products and services in the areas of network, communication, IT, and video surveillance technology, growth through customer first approach and quality services is their stated mission. The session was addressed by Mr



Jude, the CEO of the firm. He elaborated on different aspects of networks and how the internet works, how the wire connections for all networks operating throughout the world are connected underwater etc. He also did a demo using the Cisco stimulator.

Students then visited the Big Data Analytics Lab, sponsored by Tata Consultancy Services at SJU. Fr Denzil Lobo SJ, Director of the centre gave an introduction about SUB and his past work experience in St Aloysius College. Later, Ms Jayanthi gave a brief insight about the programmes, events, placements and the culture they follow in the campus. On the second day, the first visit was to National Informatics Centre (NIC). NIC works in a technical landscape marked by the continual development of electronic devices and fast advances in

ICT technologies such as Mobility, Cloud, Big Data, Artificial Intelligence, Blockchain and the Internet of Things (IoT). Having already made important contributions to R&D, NIC is trying to increase R&D activities inside the organisation in order to extend research activity in key fields and achieve proven widescale advances in government technology usage and management. Here, Mr Swaminathan, one of the officials, briefed students about cloud computing as well as blockchain and about the data centre in NIC. Students were then taken around the data centre rack and national knowledge network and given a brief about its workings and the power systems.

Students then visited MResult Technologies Centre. Mr Rakesh Verma discussed the corporate work culture, ethics, and belief in a flat hierarchy. He also discussed the open cabins that the company uses to reinforce this concept. Because the work is so equally distributed there contrary to a startup, he said that having a window for development at MNCs is hard and the learning can freeze at a certain point. Mr Neeraj Pandey from MResult said that working at a firm will finally be about whether we need the firm or it needs us.

The students came back with added knowledge and information about the industry and its functioning.

The inaugural ceremony of the **Department of Data Science** was held on December 13, 2022 at AIMIT, St Aloysius College (Autonomous). Dr Hemalatha N, Dean IT, escorted the dignitaries to the dais. The programme began with a prayer song. Officials from MResult Services Pvt Ltd, industry partners of Data Science Course, were present on the occasion. Mr Mathi Venkat, Senior Vice-President, Data Science, Ms Padmashree Alva, Director, Talent Acquisition and Initiations, Mr Shivanand Shetty, Senior Director, Data Science and Mr Lanwin, Director, Data Science from MResult were present.

In his message, Mr Venkat gave students an insight of Data Science in the IT industry and how it can be used as a foundation to build a career in the IT world. He then explained how important it is to ask questions and widen knowledge in the day-to-day life.

Director Rev. Dr Melwyn Pinto SJ and Registrar, Dr Alwyn DSA shared their thoughts on the occasion. Principal Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ called upon the students to take every opportunity to grow as a data scientist.
