SAC holds National Seminar METANOIA '23

The Department of Social Work, St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru, organized a one-day National Level Seminar on **Manual Scavenging – METANOIA '23** on 9th March 2023 in L F Rasquinha Hall, LCRI

Sri U.T. Khader, MLA, Mangalore Constituency was the Chief Guest and Sri A.C. Vinayaraj, Corporator, Mangalore City Corporation was the Guest of Honour. Principal, Rev. Dr Praveen Martis, SJ, presided over the program. Dr Deena D'Souza, Head of the Department of Social Work, Ms Kavya Aithappa, Convenor of the programme and Joshan John, the student coordinator were on the dais.

Sri U.T. Khader in his speech said, that the manual scavengers are very important people in our life. He called them social doctors and that without them it is difficult to keep our city clean. But at the same time, somewhere society neglects and keeps them away due to their work or caste. The duty of the society is to take responsibility of eradicating such social evils and show concern to such people. He urged the youth to spread



awareness about cleanliness and hygiene in the society. Sri A.C. Vinayaraj briefed about the difficulties of manual scavenging and the way they are treated by the society. He said that most of the lower caste people are engaged such kind of work and the upper caste will not take up such jobs. He urged the audience to take measures to prevent manual scavenging. He explained the problems and difficulties faced by the manual scavengers and requested the youth to understand their responsibility in the society.

Rev. Dr Praveen Martis, in his presidential remarks

spoke on manual scavenging. He said that, we can achieve something when knowledge is combined with action. He urged the students to help the weaker sections of the society and that everyone should be treated with dignity.

This seminar was organized to educate and sensitize the audience on the practice of manual scavenging. The seminar discussed the close relationship between manual scavenging and caste, the health concerns related to its practice, the law and its implantation and finally, about organizing the movement towards the liberation of persons involved in the practice of manual scavenging.

3 sessions were held during the programme. Dr Sylvia Karpagam, Public Health Physician & Researcher took up the I Session. The II Session was taken up by Dr Siddarth Joshi, Activist & Researcher and the III Session was taken up by Ms Maitreyi, (AICCTU), Advocate and Mr Shanmugam V (AICCTU), Member of BBMP Pourakarmikara Sangha.

A guest talk on "Transition phase – Campus to Corporate"

12.15 PM, which was held in the Audio Visual Room of Arrupe Block.

The session began with a prayer song by Mr. Jackson and Ms. Sindhu. The resource person, Mr. Sumith S. Rao, Proprietor of Olympus gave his insights on how the employees are required to blend themselves in the work environment. He demonstrated various ways in which a person will deal with his or her juniors and seniors in the corporate world. He insisted that ethics in work place play a major role in shaping a person's career.

There was an overall positive feedback on the talk, benefiting the students who would be part of the corporate world in near future.

Special Lecture on "Science and Freedom"

The Nehru Study Centre, Mangalore University in collaboration with the Department of Political Science, St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru, organised a special lecture on "Science and Freedom", by Prof. V K Tripathi, Former Professor of Physics, IIT, Delhi on 28 March, 2023.

The session began with a prayer song by the students of II and III BA. Prof. Rajaram Tolpadi, Director In-Charge of the Nehru Study Centre, introduced the speaker of the session, Prof. Tripathi, and also welcomed the gathering. Dr. Rose Veera DSouza, Head of the Department of Political Science, gave a floral welcome to the speaker. The talk was attended by the students of I, II, and III BA Political Science. The audience also had faculty from Mangalore University.



The speaker Prof. Tripathi began his talk by laying down the significance of open mindedness in exploring ideas in the light of humans becoming slaves of their own thinking. He said that from his experience of reading the sacred texts of various faiths, he has learnt that all of them advocate the same thing— accountability. We must take responsibility for our actions and refrain from doing anything that would cause harm to others.

Prof. Tripathi gave a timeline of modern science— from Newton's Law of Motion in 1686 to the invention of the steam engine in 1776. He spoke on how the steam engine led to the emergence of textile mills, and he made a mention of the four essential things a machine required— iron, coal, raw materials, and markets. The speaker referred to historian Adam Jones's book "The Genocide: An Extended Introduction", where the author has made an interesting observation that India hadn't experienced famines for around three centuries prior to British imperialism. He mentioned how the British gained political and administrative control over the country after the Battle of Plassey of 1757, which they won through fraudulent means. With this, they established their textile mills in the country and brought about the ruin of the Indian textile mills, which once topped in the world market. This indicated how science became an instrument of



oppression and of hunger. Science was used to further political motives and vested interests; it soon became an instrument of slavery.

The speaker also spoke about the oil and petroleum developments under the Ottoman Empire, and how after the First World War, the imperialist powers took over their oil resources. Prof. Tripathi stressed on the fact that atrocity committed on any individual, a popular person or a commoner, deserves equal condemnation and response. The speaker cited the example of Congo, which was under the control of Belgium. They had precious reserves of tantalum, which is used in making computer chips. But these mines did not come under the control of the local people even after independence. Congo, despite being the richest in minerals, is one among the poorest countries of Africa, because even today their mines are not theirs. The consequences of all these developments were slavery of people, suppression and enslavement of third world countries.

Prof. Tripathi emphasised the point that comfort in life is a very small part of living, and it is human ambition to attain comfort. But if one shuts one's mouth and closes one's eyes, then one shall be paying a heavy price for momentary comfort. Prejudice must not cripple one. Science has enabled replacement of manual power and replacement of memory.

The speaker elaborated on how he views imperialism in three phases— imperialism in India, neo-imperialism after the Second World War, and sectarianism during the Cold War leading to the disintegration of the Soviet Union and the emergence of globalisation and free markets. He made a reference to how the British employed the policy of "Divide and Rule" and made use of religious disharmony and casteism that existed in India. Religion became an instrument of prejudice and perpetuation.

Prof. Tripathi then spoke about an interesting observation he made through a study that there has been a sharp hike in the intake of students in higher education in various courses, but this apparent positive change instead of liberating people has actually done the opposite. Educated people are supporting polarisation and it is extremely alarming. He also drew a parallel between the attitude of the natives living in foreign countries earlier and the change that was seen after the 1990s.

He emphasised saying that education and science ought to bring about humility and sensitivity, and must promote humanism. Humility will bring sensitivity which helps in seeing the truth. Science demands objectivity, and one will be able to do experiments better when one forgets about identity. We are in an advancing society, and we should realise that our religion is never superior to our neighbour's religion nor our caste to our neighbour's caste.

The speaker concluded saying that the students are privileged to be receiving education at good institutions, and they must use the same to develop sensitivity and a sense of understanding that all are equal and deserve respect. The students must realise that education gives them the responsibility of building a better society and country. Prof. Tripathi also sang a ghazal giving the message of humility and sensitivity.

Talk on Hydroponics and Aquaponics

On March 3, 2023, the Bioscience Association of St Aloysius College, Mangaluru, conducted a seminar on hydroponics in the Xavier Auditorium. The seminar was led by Mr. Avinash, who provided important information about the significance of hydroponics. Students from other associations were also present during the seminar.

The programme began with an invocation by Maithri and Veeksha of II BSc . Sri Raksha of II BSc, compere of the programme, introduced and welcomed the speaker Mr Avinash Prabhu, who is currently a BCom student of St Aloysius Evening College . The resource speaker spoke about Hydroponics where plants are grown without the usage of soil, its working conditions, chemical composition, advantages and disadvantages . Hydroponics is a method of growing plants without soil, where the plants are grown in a nutrient-rich water solution. This method of cultivation is becoming increasingly popular as it uses less water, space, and fertilizers than traditional farming methods. It is also a sustainable method of farming, which means it is better for the environment.

Hydroponics has many advantages over traditional farming methods. Firstly, hydroponics uses up to 90% less water than traditional farming methods, making it more sustainable and better for the environment. Secondly, hydroponics does not require soil, which means it can be done in areas where soil quality is poor or in urban areas where space is limited. Thirdly, hydroponics is a more efficient method of farming, with higher yields per square meter than traditional farming. Benefits of hydroponics included reduced pests, faster growth, easy maintenance, high plant quality including taste. The keynote speaker also spoke about Aquaponics where fish and plants are grown together in recirculating symbiotic



system . Guppy fish and snake head fishes are added to increase productivity . This method is advantageous over hydroponics as Fish and vegetables can be grown together and the excreta of fish has essential nutrients for the growth of plant. The programme ended with feed back from several students and vote of thanks rendered by Diya of II BSc . Students Ms Anamika and Mr Jishnu and Staff Dr Sana Sheikh, were the Coordinators of the event.




As part of 'Say no to Violence', the station broadcast seven episodes of recorded programmes, narrowcast programmes and outreach programmes in various places in




English Play 'Can't Pay, Won't Pay'

Digital palm leaf manuscripts, Pokhran's splinter Rocks handed over to St Aloysius Museum

A unique symposium on "Archives-A Repository of Knowledge in the Digital Age" - a learning, experience, and ideas organized by the St Aloysius Museum in association with Department of Kannada, St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru on Friday, 3rd March 2023 in the Museum Hall.

Former Vice-chancellor and Scholar, Prof. B A Vivek Rai, in his keynote address said, "Educational courses should be centres for spreading knowledge. Museums should not be dumping centres of ancient materials. They should be used for research. The museum or Museology is part of colonialism. This culture was in Europe during 1960-65. Later, it was called modern Museology, which means not



gathering things from other places and conserving them but knowing how to use them. The third stage is called critical museology, which deals with ethics."

He also said that there are 5,000 manuscripts in the manuscriptology department in Kannada University, including 3,500 palm-leaf manuscripts and 3,000 digital manuscripts. He further said that we need a digital form of archives. Digitalization is also important because physical space is very difficult in the upcoming days. The role of digital libraries is very important in the contemporary times. We should collect and conserve things that are very rare. Our educational institutions should make museums or archives of the rare items. He also said that the name Valencia is named after the city in Spain. There are many European names in the city for example like Kordel. So that we can make an archive of the places in Mangaluru.

During the programme, Kadatthilashree S A Krishnaiah, founder-director of Prachya Sanchaya (Oriental Archives) handed over the book version of palm leaf manuscripts of Drona Parva, a chapter of Gadugina Bharata written by Kumara Vyasa, and a splinter of the basement rocks of Pokhran to Rev. Fr Melwin J Pinto, the Rector of St Aloysius Institutions. He said that the splinter of the basement rock of Pokhran was handed to him by Colonel B Ramachandra Rao, who is also an alumnus of Aloysius College. The splinter belonged to the Pokhran-II nuclear test site experimented on in the year 1998.

Mr Krishnaiah in his speech explained about the palm tree which is also called 'Sritala' (Corypha umbraculifera) or Talipot palm which is on the verge of extinction. These palm leaves, which were used as manuscripts in the ancient times, are now listed in the International Union for Conservation of Nature (ICUN) Red List. There is a blind belief about the palm tree that

something bad will happen if we plant the palm sapling. But palm leaves were used in manuscripts from the time of Buddha to the present time. I have witnessed people



throwing the manuscripts without knowing their value; I have conserved 810 such palm-leaf manuscripts, he added. He further said that he is inspired by a Jain woman named 'Siri' who made efforts to save Sritala by donating its seeds. Till date, he saved 84200 palm trees which is a symbol of greenery, food, and hunger. Besides this, the tree has medicinal components also.

Rector of St Aloysius College Rev. Fr Melwin J Pinto presided over the programme. Staff and students of the College were present for the programme. Dr Vishwanatha Badikana welcomed the gathering. Dr Dinesh Nayak

Research Guides Meeting - Minutes

Meeting of Research Guides of Mangalore University held on March 1, 2023 at 3 PM in the Conference Hall of Administrative Block. The proceedings of the meeting for the consideration and implementation by the Heads of the Departments and Research Guides are stated below;

- Some departments have more number of applications for PhD Registration than the available vacancies. Preference should be given to the staff members who applied from our college.
- Heads of the research departments should keep in touch with the Chairman of the respective department at the University to make follow up of the PhD admission process and also regarding the new guideship applications forwarded from the College.
- Heads of the research department must see that applications for guideship are forwarded to the University when a teacher becomes eligible for guideship.
- All the Heads of the Departments are asked to communicate information of the candidates to the University through the Research and Development Cell (RDC) and the Principal.
- No-due certificate must be obtained for cancellation, transfer or at the time of submission of the thesis by clearing all fees, laboratory, library and other dues. HR section may keep necessary documents of the PhD scholars.
- The research guides are asked to build up a rapport with the PhD scholars and at least one meeting in alternate months should be arranged and College fee must be paid in stipulated time so that it will motivate the PhD scholars to work and also reduce the burden of accumulated unpaid fee at the end of the PhD work.
- ID card and library cards will be provided to the PhD Scholars once they pay the first year fee at the University and also at the college.
- Half yearly progress report in the required format must be submitted to monitor the progress of research and same should be presented in the department before submission. A copy must be sent to RDC.
- Departments having Research Centre may organize at least one national/international conference with provision for publication of papers in UGC CARE journals.
- The PhD students should be encouraged to participate/ present the research findings in National/ international conferences so that they get more ideas and contacts. All must insist for at least two publications before completing PhD work.
- The Dean-Research capacity building will facilitate interaction of all PhD scholars at least twice in the year.
- A format to collect the details of Research scholars who have already joined will be sent to all departments by RDC soon.

WONDERLA

Report on the Wonderla Industrial visit which took place on 24th of february 2023, located at Kochi in the state of Kerala visited by Bcom E batch guided by the lecturers of commerce department Dr. Caroleena Janefer and Mr.



Akshith Kumar. The class reported to Wonderla at 10:00 am and after enjoying the dry rides as well as the water rides the class united at the industry at 4:30 pm. We had a good experience with the guide in the industry as he explained how the water in the park was treated and cleaned for reuse. Basically it was the water plant through which water was supplied to the whole of wonderla. The waste water gets used for watering plants etc. The tank used for at Wonderla has a capacity of 3 lakh liters. For the pools and water slides they use 70% of drinking water and 30% of chlorine water. Every hour 50 thousand liters of water gets disposed and added on. Water gets supplied continuously for around 8 hours. The dirt from the water gets collected in a different container and gets disposed later on.

ACHOOR TEA FACTORY:

Report on Visit to Achoor Tea factory which took place on 25th February 2023, located at Wayanad visited by Bcom E batch guided by commerce department lecturers Dr. Caroleena Janefer and Mr. Akshith Kumar. We arrived at the Achoor Tea Factory at 9:30 AM. They educated us with the entire process of making tea powder from raw, fresh tea leaves. There are 4 types of tea production: white tea, CTC, green tea and black tea. The industry we visited involved in the production of CTC tea packin. It begins with dumping the tea leaves into the withering trough, which is shredded in the shredder. It then passes

through the CTC machines which has two wheels which work both clock wise and anti-clock wise . Next up it goes through the fermentation drum which is 1100 degrees in temperature. It is sent to the drier, trinic sorter and sent for winnowing. Then the final product is sent



for binning, after which it is packed and dispatched for sale.

PANDA FOODS (INDIA) LTD

Report on Visit TO Panda foods (India) LTD which took place on 25th February 2023, located at Wayanad visited by B Com E batch guided by commerce department lecturers Dr. Caroleena Janefer and Mr. Akshith Kumar. We arrived at the industry at 11:30 am. We were asked to wear caps to cover our hair and phones were strictly not allowed. They showed us their godown where the raw materials would come in. they showed us how packaging and labelling of the product is done. They even



made us taste their lime pickle which was very tasty. They manufacture spices, coffee, pickle etc. they showed us the coffee and the pickle making process.







This full-time on-campus course is an interface between policy, law, and social sciences, and is open to students from all academic disciplines. The MPP programme promotes reflective learning through field exposure and client-led projects.
