The chief guest in his keynote address said that he was successful in his endeavors towards his company after numerous hurdles because his institution had given him a good foundation. Social Science and Social Development

Mangalore Sociology Association, Mangaluru with the Department of Sociology and Humanities Association of St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru organized a UGC sponsored two day National Conference on 'Social Science and Social Development' on 12 and 13 February, 2016 at 10 am in the Eric Mathais Hall. The Chief Guest and Guest of Honor for the occasion were **Dr Bindeshwar Pathak**, Founder, Sulab International Social Service Organization, New Delhi and **Prof. Nil Ratan**, A. N. Sinha Institute of Social Studies, Patna.



In his Chief Guest address **Dr Bindeshwar Pathak** encouraged the audience to intervene in problems of society as it is the job of a true sociologist to intervene and find a solution to the problem. He urged the masses to think about the people who are lagging about in society and find ways to show light for complete social development. Continuing on the topic of Social Development he said, "Without every person of the society, you cannot have social development." He spoke about restoring the human rights and values to the untouchables and bringing them to the center of society. He advised the students to always build a good rapport with the communities with which you want to work. He then told the listeners that there are black holes and dark spots in the society which makes it difficult to intervene into their social problems.

Prof. Nil Ratan, the guest for the occasion, said that in the hype of economic development, empowerment and development somewhere a large part of the society has been left behind. Concerning social development he said, "The paradigm of social development is challenged." He also said, "The political, social and economic deprivation is just making the rich, richer and the poor, poorer and it is due to this that the social development today is in fragments." Prof. Ratan brought to light that this fragmentation was a global problem and that these were issues that were challenging social minds.

In his presidential address, **Rev. Fr Denzil Lobo SJ**, Rector of St Aloysius Institutions conveyed that the

Jesuits in their 500 years strive to educate the masses have effectively upheld their motto in transforming men and women for others. He told the audience that we are a diverse nation but it is our duty as elements of the society to unify it. He said, "Education is the most powerful weapon for change." He urged the students to replace consumption with sacrifice, greed with generosity and wastefulness with sharing.



During the inauguration the department released the anthology of poems composed by its students, titled *Scribblings*. The students whose poems were published were honoured with a memento.



Women's Forum

Citizens Forum for Mangalore Development (CFMD) in association with the Women's Forum of St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru organized a talk and interactive session on "**Freedom and Dissent in a Democracy**" on Monday, 8 February, 2016 at 3:00 pm in the Eric Mathais Hall of the campus. The key speaker for the session was **Ms Kavita Krishnan**, Secretary of the All India Progressive Women's Association (AIPWA), voice of the Nirbhaya Protest in Delhi and the editor of '**Liberation**', the monthly publication of the Communist party of India (Marxist-Leninist) (CPI-ML).

Ms Kavita Krishnan in her address told the multitude



that dissent is the vehicle of existing truth. She articulated that society frowns upon the right to dissent today, just like it did in the times of Copernicus and Galileo. She said, "It is important to speak the truth to power." She stated that forms of discipline

weren't just a problem of mindset and culture, they were problems due to a structural method by which the society functioned resulting in a large number of people benefitting from the maintenance of this system. Ms Krishnan urged that women needed to be safe but in the name of safety, they were locked up and their rights were taken away from them. She also said that concern and control were operating in rather messy ways resulting in women's safety being compromised. She mentioned that a girl child who is less exposed to the world and not given the freedom to make mistakes is more in danger than other girl because authoritarian ways of safety made women unsafe. Concluding her talk she said, "Any society grows only through dissent."

The talk was then followed by a very active interactive session where **Ms Kavita Krishnan** answered many substantial questions on rape, immoral policing, lowering of Juvenile age and increasing the age of consent etc.

A prize distribution for the online competitions "**Reinventing Youngistaan Mangaluru**" organized by the **Citizens Forum for Mangalore Development (CFMD)** along with **Youth Empowered in Action for Humanity (YEAH)**, Bengaluru was held and the prizes were given away by **Ms Kavita Krishnan**.

Research Committee Meeting

A meeting of the Research Committee was held on February 12, 2016 at 3.40 pm in the conference Room. Eighteen members were present for the meeting. The meeting was convened by Rev. Fr Melwyn D'Cunha.

Principal's comments:

Rev. Fr Swebert D'Silva proposed that more of projects and case study must be included in the curriculum to facilitate participative learning among the students.

He also expressed concern that some Minor Research Projects have not done justice to terms of report submission or fund utilization. He also pointed out that our present method of disbursing the entire money to individual accounts is not the correct way. Especially, when someone leaves the institution and goes away. Most organizations release the grants only upon production of bills. Considering the large number of projects that we have, an appropriate system must be evolved. Father, urged that those without projects



and those in-between projects must again submit minor research proposals.

He stressed that Major Research Projects are the need of the hour. Our staffs with PhD have to be encouraged to update their research publications so that they achieve the eligibility to become research guides.

Fr Dr Melwyn D'Cunha presented the reports of the previous meeting and the major outcomes. Fr mentioned that underutilization of the funds by a few people was one of the hurdles he faced. He felt that PhD scholars must be encouraged to keep the six monthly reports ready for timely submission to University.

Dr Smitha shared her views on improving the web presence of our college, particularly in research. She explained how useful Research Gate and Google scholar accounts are in building up our College profile. Its easy to link our individual profile to the college. This will enable any agency to verify the claims made by us online.

Tumkur Univesity Ph.D. guiding situation and suggestions :

Dr Richard Gonsalves briefed the gathering of the present status of Tumkur University research centre. He said that the students whose registration was delayed has finally been approved, effective from 2013. Now these students have to submit 4-5 half yearly reports within a short notice. New students were allotted under some faculty. As of now the UGC circular may not pose a serious threat as we are recognized as a center. Dr Richard stressed that those already registered will not face any problems, but the same cannot be said for future admissions.

Those students who have submitted at least one six monthly report have been asked to pay Rs 500/- to Finance office and have been issued ID cards. 24 such students are there.

Dr Saraswathi and Dr Badikana expressed concern that there is no communication from the University and they get calls from students saying they are allotted under them. Even though students have to spend at least three months with the guide, hardly any have turned up and guides find it very difficult to keep track of what students are doing. Infact there is no rapport between the guides and students and this may cause serious problems in future. Not only that, they are asked to take 8 students at time. Dr Norbert Lobo said he also was pressurized to take more students than what he was willing to. He expressed concern that due to uncertainty with registration, many didn't work and now that registration is cleared, making 4-5 reports has become very challenging. The PhD program is now scheduled in a very time bound manner such that in 3 years a candidate has to submit.

The members decided to call for a meeting of guides and students of Tumkur University in the last week of March to discuss the issues.

Mangalore University:

Dr Asha, mentioned that in Mangalore University, every year guides have to declare their vacancy and accordingly students are allotted.

Any other matter:

Money matters:

Dr Asha Abraham stated that she had incurred Rs. 70,000 in the Major Research Project due to non sanctioning of second instalment by the UGC. Similar incidents were narrated by Fr Leo, Dr Nagalakshmma and Dr Smitha Hegde.

Research scholar presentations:

Dr Tanima Banerjee suggested that a Doctoral committee be set up and that this committee sit through presentations before six monthly report submission so that research scholars can improve their reports based on suggestion.

She also suggested that since most of us do not know the research happening in the college, it would be nice to have monthly presentation by the staff for the benefit of others. Fr Melwyn said such presentations are already there and it was mostly in biological sciences and therefore not informed to others thinking it may not be useful. Hereafter, the details will be sent through common mail.

PG Student Projects:

Dr Suresh Poojary wanted to know if student projects will be called this year. Fr Melwyn replied he had sent the call through common mail but did not receive any applications. He was willing to send again. However, he said unless Utilization Certificate of the previous student project is given, it may be difficult to sanction again. Dr Smitha suggested that those departments who have submitted Utilization Certificate be granted the student projects.

Concluding remarks:

The members expressed that there are a few officials who could be tapped for Research Funding in UGC as well as in DBT. There was also a suggestion to use the Pilot plant for commercial purpose.

Fr Melwyn, Research Coordinator thanked the committee for the fruitful participation and the meeting ended on a happy note.

- Dr Veronica J. Carlo thanked all the members' support to her in managing the administrative block smoothly during her tenure as Vice Principal.



Research brings life to stories, says writer

MANGALURU: Novelist Kunal Basu said diaspora is a state of mind and it has nothing to do with geographic locations.

Speaking after inaugurating a national seminar on 'Dislocation, Identities, Multiculturalism and the Diaspora' organised by the Postgraduate Department of English, St Aloysius College, in association with Pan Macmillan India at Eric Mathias Hall of the college on Wednesday, he said dislocation does not happen due to reasons as well, he observed. Basu said he is not a part of diaspora and his roots are in Kolkata. He never migrated and did not intend to be an NRI either, he added.

Speaking on creative process of writing, Basu said every novel is a creative challenge for him. Impulse, method and appraisal do happen before publication of the work. It took him 25 years for 'The Japanese Wife' to develop as a story in his mind, he said.

He said daydreaming gives him a connection to the story and unveils the possibilities of playing with the story. He said he develops the idea through planned experiences. The best experience for him was to travel. Writing, unlike many other disciplines, is not a standardised toolkit. Research brings life to stories, he said and advised students to hunt for stories to be written. This interior language is heard by the reader," Basu said.

On his recent novel, 'Kalkatta', he said the work is based on the lives of subterranean Bengalis. One could see the subterranean dialect of Bangla as the centre of gravity of the world, in which the novel will be written.


