EPITOME 2k17

PITOME 2K17', a national-level fest organised by St Aloysius Institute of Management and Information Technology (AIMIT), was inaugurated on Thursday Feb-



ruary 16, at the AIMIT Beeri campus by Dr Yogesh Dube, special executive officer, government of Maharashtra, Dr Dube, a member of the Indian Council for Cultural Research, government of India, and Dr Sanjay Dessai, Vice Principal of Shree Damodar College of Commerce and Economics, Goa.

On the theme of the programme 'Surgical Strike', Prof Santhosh Rebello, Dean, School of Information Technology, AIMIT, enlightened the audience on how it equates to a new realm of cognitive solutions in the application of technology. Cognitive solutions used for strategic management would lead to systems programmed to train new systems. He said that current technology is more oriented toward requirements of strategic corporate decisions that are intuitive and futuristic and this is possible by the use of cognitive solutions.

Dr Dube, in his inaugural address expressed his admiration for St Aloysius College in organizing this kind of unparalleled event in the field of technology. He said the IT boom has affected the affluent in further development, whereas the same positive effect should be extended to rural life as well. The computer chip which has been used as an extended part of the human brain should be used for productive use in business and government, leveraging the development in earth and satellite based support structures. Dr Dube said technology, with its intended and unintended use, wins in the long run, in its capacity of infinite power of global reach by use of optical fibre, storage capacity, and display devices. It is the responsibility of the current generation to use it for the good of people and especially for the

development of children and the disabled, he said.

Dr Sanjay Dessai was the guest of honour. With his indepth knowledge on facts and figures, his take on surgical strike put more emphasis on where our priorities should be. He gave a rundown on the use of resources in defense against education. He also reiterated the importance of educating children on the positive impact of propagation and dissemination of peace.

Fr Denzil Lobo, Director of AIMIT partly referred to the interview of Satya Nadella of Microsoft on information technology, in which Nadella said 'Longevity in this business is about being able to reinvent yourself or invent the future'. Fr Denzil talked about how big companies should reinvent for dominance in the marketplace and avoid the fear of risk of innovation. The future belongs to innovation, he said, recalling his earlier discus-



sion with academicians, and relentless innovation is the only solution for future growth and sustenance.

The vote of thanks was delivered by Suman Lasrado, faculty coordinator of EPITOME 2017. He also gave an update on the latest number of participants registered for this event, from within and out of state colleges, at 30-plus colleges with more than 350 students.

Almost 20 different events were held during the two day fest. Valedictory function of EPITOME 2k17 was held on February 17 2017 at 4.30 pm. Dr. Devraj, Director, SDM Inst. Of Management was the Chief Guest. Ms. Rajshri Buglari, DGM, Union Bank of India was the guest of honor.

SHOOTING STARS

"The job of a scriptwriter lies somewhere in between finding a great idea and telling a story" – Anjali Menon

'Shooting Stars'- a National Level Seminar and film making competition was organized at St Aloysius College by the Department of Journalism on 18 February 2017 at the LF Rasquinha Auditorium. The theme for this year's Shooting Stars was- Script Writing – "The Salt of Cinema".

The inaugural ceremony commenced with the arrival of Anjali Menon, an eminent scriptwriter and director in the Malayalam film industry, as the Chief Guest and Adarsh H Eshwarappa, an upcoming Kannada filmmaker, as the Guest of Honour. The session was presided over by Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ, Principal Designate and Director of DDU Kaushal Kendra. Dr A M Narahari, Registrar of St Aloysius College was also present as the Guest of Honour.

The welcome address was delivered by Ms Bhavya Shetty, HOD of Department of Journalism and convener of Shooting Stars which was followed by the ceremonial lighting of the lamp by the dignitaries on the dais. Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ delivered the presidential address wherein he inspired the students and encouraged the students to aim greater height in the years to come. "Formation is a process of education but transformation also is equally important" said Dr A M Narahari in his address and lauded the efforts of film makers and pointed out how making cinema is a challenge to create a great audience.



The first session was conducted by Ms Anjali Menon who in her discourse focused on nitty-gritties of script writing. "Script is a spring board from which you jump off to make a movie" said Menon. She emphasized on the importance of a script, as a movie would fall flat without it. To kick start the process of scriptwriting, getting inspired is an integral part. To be inspired we need to dip into ourselves and dig out those important and intimate experiences of life. A process of introspection as a necessary tool was highlighted in her speech. Her advice to the budding filmmakers was to connect to the audience and build empathetic relationship in order to make

simple yet relatable films which will resonate with experiences of the audience. An interaction session ensued, after which, the screening of films, submitted by colleges from all over the nation was held.



The second session was held by Adarsh H Eshwarappa on the topic "From Paper to Screen". This session involved a talk on filmmaking and the vital role that a screenplay holds in the production of a movie. In order to tackle life problems one must have the experience of being hit hard by life, said Mr Eshwarappa. As an aspiring filmmaker, his advice to the young scriptwriters is to dive into the subject and amass a large knowledge of cinema. He also said "Beyond your talent or ability, what you need is patience in order to be a filmmaker". This was followed by an interactive session.

The valedictory function was presided over by Rev. Fr Pradeep Sequeira, the Finance Officer of St Aloysius College. Dr Alwyn D'Sa, Vice Principal, was the Chief Guest and Dr Vishanz Pinto, Dean of Arts faculty was the Guest of Honour. The Chief Guest for the seminar was **Professor Valerian Rodriguez**, Research fellow ICSSR and former Professor at JNU, New Delhi and inaugurated the seminar by lighting the lamp.

The Chief Guest in his address spoke on the importance of political science in civic engagement. He also emphasized on the history of civic engagement in India. This was followed by an interactive session where students and faculty actively participated.

He also said that 'Digitization' and 'Cashless society' are the two buzzwords of the society at the present. This is well supported by features such as ECS, CTS, NEFT and RTGS which are prevailing in the Banking sector nowadays. He also directed the students to enrol for additional certification courses through Banking Institutes to enhance their knowledge and insights.

Ms. Rajshri Baglari in her speech gave a definition of Digitial India. She also spoke on the growth of Union Bank of India digitally over the years. Fr. Session 1: Speaker: Ms. Rajshri Baglari

She then mentioned about the Union Bank of India and Why go for Union Bank and what are the various schemes and services offered. Workshop on 'Introduction to Bioinformatics and Biological Databases'

A one day workshop on 'Introduction to Bioinformatics and Biological Databases' was conducted on 23rd February 2017 by St Aloysius Institute of Management and Information Technology (AIMIT), St. Aloysius

During these sessions various concepts such as areas of interest in Bioinformatics and its applications, biological databases, visualization tools and sequence analysis, algorithms and applications were discussed.

During the lab session, participants were given demonstrations and hands on session on various databases, visualization tools and sequence alignment and analysis tools. The lab session was handled by 1st and 2nd year MSc Bioinformatics students.

IQAC Meeting

- he IQAC Meeting was held on February 23, 2017 at 3.45 pm in the Conference Room.
- Rev. Fr Principal welcomed the gathering, especially the external experts of IQAC.
- Dr Denis Fernandes read the minutes of the IQAC meeting held on August 13, 2015. He also presented the follow up of the meeting which was approved by the members.
- On the question of restructuring the courses, Dr Devaraj pointed out the change in the nomenclature of BBM course to BBA has improved the admission of students to the course. However the students feel that they have more choices in B.Com rather than in BBA and hence they prefer to join B.Com.
- Mr Gerard Colaco pointed out that the students who complete the course and come out from the colleges lack communication skills and hence they are not able to impress upon the interview board. He also pointed out that a few market demanding courses to be introduced in the college and in that respect Economics, Mathematics and Statistics is a good combination in B.Sc. He was of the opinion that campus recruitments will not attract our students because the pay offered by these companies is not attractive. Therefore there must be greater trust on entrepreneurship. Students should be encouraged to continue in their own passion. For that college has to engage and collaborate with the outside world such as Canara Chamber of Commerce.
- Mr Colaco raised concerned over the General Health of our students. The modern generation lacks physical exercise. They are more dependent on technology rather than getting into physical exercise. The college can look into these matters seriously. At the same time he brought women's issues, women's work and general health of the family which could be priority in our education system. He urged the college to take initiative in training our youth in competitive examinations and to encourage more and more people towards government employment.
- A few members expressed their concern that in spite of their hard effort the industries are not opening up to collaborate with the educational institutions.
- Mr Joselyn Lobo pointed out that the college can establish a separate centre for international partnership. Mr Rajsheekar suggested to enter into Sakura Exchange programme to send our students to Japan-Asia Youth Exchange Programme which will be a programme between Indian and Japanese Govts.
- Prof. Abdul Rahman requested that the college can prepare a strategic plan and develop a vision document for implementation in the coming years. He also noted the environmental issues could be seriously taken up and urged to stick on British standard international green audit with specification for environmental management system.

- Dr Norbert Lobo pointed out that there is a need to empower teachers to handle the students. He stated that the language taught for commerce students should be in conformity with their subjects.
- The Principal informed the members that the collage is planning to enter into deemed to be university status. However the members felt that the college can opt for private university status in Karnataka because for each university a separate Act is drafted in Karnataka and therefore a careful and cautious drafting could be done for St Aloysius University.
- The meeting ended with vote of thanks by the Registrar.

The students were also educated about the cost and pricing of the final product. Modern rice mill gave an insight as to nothing goes waste in this business.

Industrial Visit to KMF

On 16th February 2017, the students of business Administration of AIMIT were taken Karnataka Milk Federation (KMF) in Mangalore. As soon as we entered the plant, there were around 100-200 crates of curd kept to ferment. When asked, the worker told us that it was best for the curd to be fermented in a natural way rather than using any other chemicals.

The next chamber consisted of various machines of packaging and also storage of pasteurized milk. This milk is then sent to packaging through the pipes situated above on the ceiling. The machines design and heat the packets of milk for firm sealing. Also one can adjust the size of the packets by these machines. He informed that around 70 packets of milk are dispatched in a batch.



<u>The crates section:</u> The crates in which milk packets are transported are first washed in the hot water and then soon washed in the cool water and then sent to the packaging area.

The refrigeration chamber: A big room meant for the artificial refrigeration of milk packets so that they don't get spoilt. The temperature in this room is 4°C. He also showed us the different packets of milk and the significance of each packet. Around 2, 80,000 to 3, 80,000 litres of milk is processed and dispatched to the whole Mangalore district within a day.

<u>Dock Section:</u> The farmers or milkmen deliver the stock of milk here on or before 2.00 AM. They come in cans or in trucks. The machine opens the lid, checks the weight and density and then puts the milk in the milk drainage. When the milk arrives, it is cooled to extreme so that it does not get spoilt. To make curd, it is heated to 90°C and then cooled to 30°C to 40°C. It is then kept till 5'clock to the atmospheric heat to form curd and then kept in cool storage.

<u>Paneer:</u> Milk is pressurised or pressed and water is drained through a white cloth. The residue left behind in the cloth is solid paneer.

Quality control laboratory: This laboratory tests all the products manufactured. There is a lactometer which checks the amount of water, fatomatic checks fat, and EMT in society.

On the whole the industrial visit was educational and instructional.


