### SIXTH GRADUATION CEREMONY

The Sixth Graduation Ceremony of St. Aloysius College, Mangaluru was held on 9 July 2016, at 3 p.m. at Loyola Hall, St. Aloysius PU College, Mangaluru. Rev. Fr Stanislaus D'Souza SJ, Provincial Karnataka Jesuit Province, declared the ceremony open followed by the Oath-taking ceremony led by Rev. Fr Dionysius Vaz SJ, Rector of St Aloysius Institutions. There were a total of 1638 graduates with 924 UG Graduates and 579 PG Graduates present.



The programme was graced by the presence of the Chief Guest, Prof. Dr K. Byrappa, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Mangalore University; who in his Convocation Address stated that education should be seen as a stepping stone to character building and societal development. He stressed on higher education as the key to making available a large pool of skilled manpower for our nation and also to shape a student's personality. He said that our country's education system is burdened with demands of both quantity and quality and so the private sector should contribute its best to the provision of higher education in India. He also expressed that the objectives of reform and change in our higher education system must be expansion, excellence and inclusion and that a transparent framework for better service delivery be established in the field of private education. The time now is to modernize our education system to build on the existing strengths in light of new understanding of the research-innovation-growth linkage. The time has come to create a second wave of institution building and of excellence in the fields of education, research and capability

He also distributed the cash prizes for the rank holders in BA Under-Graduation level, sponsored by Mr. Sharanguda, in memory of his son Mr. Banu Prakash, a former student of the college.

Rev. Fr Stanislaus D'Souza SJ, President, Mangalore Jesuit Educational Society (MJES) and Provincial Karnataka Jesuit Province, addressed the graduates and said - graduation is a celebration of time well spent. He emphasized on spirituality as it will build and nourish lives. He also said that "money will come and money will go, but it is love that will strengthen and sustain you for a long time." He urged the graduates to stand up for equal rights and opportunities especially for the poor, the weak and the children. Rev. Fr Dionysius Vaz SJ, Vice-President, Mangalore Jesuit Educational Society and Rector of St Aloysius Institutions, said "I believe in hands that work, brains that think and hearts that love"



and also how we need to make sense of the world when sense and reason go missing.

### Hands on Workshop on Conservation

Dr TV Ramachandra, Scientist, Center for Ecological Sciences, IISc. Bangalore and his team members Dr. Subhash Chandra, Dr. Durga Mahapatra, Bharath Settur, Dr. Harish Bhat, Dr. Prakash Mesta, Dr. Rajashri Ray, Ms. Deepthi Hebbale and Mr. Sudarshan Bhat conducted a three day hands on workshop between 23-25th July, 2016. The development of skills of experimentation, observation, documentation, data management, presentation and publication was the focus of the workshop. They trained the undergraduate students and faculty on methods of assessing village biodiversity, undertaking biodiversity studies of terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems.



workshop inaugurated bv was T.V.Ramachandra, Rev. Fr Swebert D'Silva SJ welcomed the gathering, Rector Rev. Fr. Dioynius Vas SJ presided over the function. In his presidential address, the Rectror stressed on the need for conservation as "When adversities strike, the most affected are the poor, while the rich inspite of being major contributors towards destruction of natural habitats continue to behave in an irresponsible manner." Rev. Fr Leo D'Souza SJ introduced the concept of workshop and inspired the participants to conserve trees, particularly in the surrounding areas. Seven students and staff of SVS Bantwal College, fifty six school students from Alvas School, Puttige and Moodabidri participated in the program along with 80 undergraduate students, life sciences, St Aloysius College, Mangalore.

### Research Cell meeting along with applicants of Minor Research Project 2016-2017

Orientation Program for those applying for UGC Minor Research Project 2016-2017

The meeting began with a prayer by Rev Dr Melwyn D'Cunha S.J. This was followed by the opening remarks by Rev Fr Swebert D'Silva S.J. Fr Principal appreciated the activities of the research cell under the guidance of Rev Dr Melwyn D'Cunha. Father mentioned that Research is an important component of any evaluation process of educational institutions. He mentioned that in a recently held meeting for applying for RUSA, it was appreciated that our college had more than 500 publications and it was far more than St. Josephs College, Bangalore. He enthused the gathering to apply for minor and major projects so as to improve the quality of research and publications.



Rev Dr Melwyn D'Cunha gave a presentation of the guidelines pertaining to the requirements for applying for the UGC minor projects. Already many projects are ready to be uploaded once the website opens for online submission. Those wanting to apply now are also welcome. The website for applying for minor project is <a href="http://www.ugc.ac.in/swro/">http://www.ugc.ac.in/swro/</a>

In general, we can apply for science projects upto 5 lakhs and Arts projects upto 3 lakhs for period of 18 months.

Fr Principal expressed hope that this year more projects will be sanctioned compared to last year. Dr Narahari mentioned that in Governing council meeting, two members appreciated that in last 5 years our college has produced 500 research publications. They also suggested that Indian Council of Social Sciences research ICSSR be approached for research funds in social sciences. It was also suggested that local industry like MCF, MRPL could be approached for collaborative research and internship. Dr Norbert Lobo added that young faculty members from social sciences can avail the funds from ICSSR. Dr Alexander, Governing council member had volunteered to help in this matter. Rev Dr Melwyn D'Cunha mentioned that Prof Tauro and Fr Leo were willing to help in correcting the project proposals.

Once projects are sanctioned, the PI has to submit the acceptance letter to UGC. At a time only one project can be handled from UGC. There should be a gap for one year between the projects. The following should be followed while carrying out the project:

- 1. Maintain work book
- 2. Maintain accounts book
- 3. Preserve all receipts of expenditure and for items where receipts are not there put vouchers eg travel (as per UGC format).
- 4. Do not alter any bill
- 5. Avoid multiple bills for the same items
- 6. Work sincerely
- 7. Buy the books/equipment at the earliest as cost escalation may happen. Librarian can be approached for procurement of books.
- 8. Any other details the research cell could be contacted
- 9. Books/Journals to be deposited in the departmental library/college library
- 10. The UGC guidelines have the format for all the annexures (II-VIII) necessary for the evaluation of the progress of the project.
- 11. Utilization certificate certified by statutory auditor is mandatory for getting the second instalment of the grants. Rs 1125/- per year must be kept from the project to pay the auditor.
- 12. Annual and final report of the project must be sent to UGC.
- 13. Upon completion of the project, a summary of the same must be put up on college website.

Fr Principal wanted to know what measures are in place to monitor the quality of the projects. Mr Naveen Mascarenes NAAC coordinator suggested that at least one conference paper presentation must come out of the UGC projects. Dr Norbert Lobo suggested that the PI be encouraged to publish in college in house journals. Already three journals are there in social sciences. Dr Smitha Hegde suggested that faculty wise presentations could be held. Like Hall of fame, the posters displaying the achievements from the projects could be displayed during seminars in LCRI and later these could be hung on the department walls. Rev Dr Praveen Martis suggested that staff and students could meet once in two months and present their work. During summer vacations, staff and students be encouraged to participate in summer research programs. Dr Smitha suggested we should also start opening up our labs to accommodate interns from other institutes. Rev. Dr Melwyn D'Cunha pointed out that already such facility is in place in Fr Leo's LAB and Dept. of Food Science and Technology.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks by Rev Dr Melwyn D'Cunha.
