The Director added that today’s VUCA world with its volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity involves challenges which are exponential in nature. Rev Fr Denzil Lobo SJ warned the students that while they were networked with thousands of people in the virtual world they had little physical contact or meaningful relationships in the real world. He maintained that orientation programs like these would enable the students to cultivate the habit of ‘critical reflection’ among the students.

The four resource persons for the day included, Rev Fr Seline Joseph, Director, St Thomas College, Belthangady, Rev Fr John Lang, Finance Officer, St Aloysius PU College, Rev Fr Pradeep, Director, Arrupe Block, St Aloysius college and Fr Rahul, Asst Parish Priest, Bejai parish.

As the new academic year unveiled the curtains for an exciting and challenging mission ahead the students of 2nd year MBA were sailed through a day’s long orientation programme with the theme ABHYUDAYA, self-elevating. There were altogether 5 priests from different parts of Mangalore of those 3 from St. Aloysius College. The first session began with a quote by Abdul Kalam “If you want success stop giving excuses, if you want to continue giving excuses then forget about success”. He then shared his own life how some incidents and people

shaped and molded his personality. Using the analogy of human life and a stone he explained that either we could build a bridge or a wall, where bridge enables others to cross over and a wall becomes a stumbling block in achieving our goals. He stressed on critical thinking by giving the examples of great personalities like Abraham Lincoln, Mark Zucker Berg and others. Three important things with which he concluded his talk was accept, change and live.

Later sessions were mainly based on three aspects- Mission, Vision and Goal. Through interaction with the students the resource persons collected some thoughts about goal. Then adequate explanation was given on the importance of goals in each one’s life. Through some activities the practical aspects and implementation of the set goals were explained which indeed kept everyone spellbound till the end of the session. There was room for understanding the need to practice some essential of values which build our interpersonal relationship and enable us to transcend our limitations. Besides, the students were invited to give a thought about the welfare of the society by way of creating a great networking.

The session on media and its impact on the current youth was very much appreciated by all the students. It was really an eye opener for it paved the path for new way of interpreting the advertisements in any sort of



media channels. Right disposition with sound critical mind is all that is needed in the present world to benefit from the media and not to be trapped by deceptive ads. The session also enlightened students on the connotative meanings in advertisements through video clips. The fourth session was focused on how having dreams was of great importance in the life of every student. The resource person told the students of dream high and always think big. With the help of few video clips he explained about how determination, willpower and a person’s inner urge could possibly take one to any heights. He said that nothing is impossible if one desperately tries for it. He also conducted a small game which enabled the students to realize how each and every physical activity is a coordination between the left and right brain. Finally he ended the session by advising the students never to stop dreaming and at the same time persuaded them to keep working hard towards their goal. Thus the whole day’s programme set a tone for the academic year making students dreamers of the new horizons dawning before them.

The 105th birth memorial celebration of Prof K A Krishnamurthy was held on 1st August 2018. The Mathematics department of UG and PG conducted a one day inter-collegiate fest for the PU and UG students of various colleges respectively.

The fest began with the inauguration ceremony which included a traditional formal function in the LF



Rasquinha hall in the LCRI Block, Dr Reena Alva, Managing Director of the MARS Learning Centre was the Chief guest who addressed the students and gave them insights on how our determination can help fight through an adverse circumstances to hit a true and well deserved goal in our lives. Principal Rev. Dr Praveen Matis SJ presided over the function and spoke about how mathematics revolves around prediction with precision. The formal function ended with a vote of thanks given by Ms. Tina Jathanna, Staff coordinator of the fest.

After a short break the Guest of honour Shri Praveen Kumar S, an alumnus, IIT Madras, gave a talk on 'Mathematics as a Career', with a very young and fresh idea so that young minds could resonate with it. He gave information regarding the different examinations students could take to get into IIT's and NIT's. The talk concluded with a question answer session.

After the guest lecture, all participants geared up and were ready for the competitions. There were a total of six events, which included a combination of group and individual events, to start of **Quizarium**, two participants made a team, they were challenged through their ability of recognition of Mathematics concepts in day-to-day pictures, followed by the questionnaire rounds, next, **Math Venture**, this event was a unique take on a simple board game and a **math scavenger hunt**, where students were asked to find real life explanation of maths concepts. Next, **Math Prix**, a well organised technological round, students here were tested for speed and precision, **Mathlantic City** one of the most eye catching events as individual players were teamed up with other college participants so that they get to know each other to bring in a sense of community development and of course a series of fun filled activities, next 'EX' This event consisted of a stress interview where the interviewers questions oscillated between maths and real life. Minutes of the UG Library Committee Meeting

A meeting of the Library Committee (UG) of the St Aloysius College (Autonomous) was held on 12th August 2018 at 4 pm in the Conference Room and considered the following agenda:

The meeting started with a prayer by Rev. Fr Pradeep Sequeira, the Finance Officer of the college. 28 members of the committee were present.

Rev. Fr Principal welcomed the members. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Members were briefed about the follow up of the suggestions made during the previous library committee meeting.

Fr Principal stressed the need for having a good functional library for any institution of higher learning and the importance of reading library books and journals in the teaching learning process of students as well as teachers. Our college library has a good collection of books and other reading material but lacks adequate space for the library users to sit and study and for stacking more books which have been added to the library every year. So we have to work towards fulfilling this objective of having sufficient space for the library keeping in view our future growth.

Many developments have been taking place in ICT and a modern library has to keep pace with the latest technology available for making the library resources as well as the functions and services up-to-date. In this regard, as a first step towards upgrading, adopting RFID technology is being planned. Members were informed about the RFID technology, how it works and the cost involved and other requirements such as smart cards for the users, sufficient well planned space for open access facility and installation of equipment.

Budget allocation for books for the previous year and the corresponding spending by each department and the proposed budget allocation for the current academic year (2018-19) was presented and approved.

Some of the points discussed were:

- Online buying of books when some books are not available in book stalls
- Selection of books to the library in the upcoming book exhibition to be held on 2-3rd August, 2018
- Giving wide publicity of digital resources available through the library.
- Fr Principal urged the members to see to it that good numbers of books need to be added by each department by spending the amount allotted to them.
- The Registrar Dr A M Narahari suggested that the Head of Department need to inform the other faculty members about the budget allocation and selection of books at the departmental meetings.
- In this regard, it was decided to send the budget proposals to all the teaching staff by mail.
- Librarian presented data of library usage by the staff and students. It was found that the users visit the library for various purposes like study, reading, reference, borrowing books etc., and this has been constant over the past 7-8 years at about 60-65 thousand per year. It may be still more because all the students

who come to the main reading room do not sign during rush hours. Use of reference section also remains more or less same over the last 7-8 years.

- However with regard to the borrowing of books by students there is a marked increase in the year 2017-18 compared to the previous years. It was a good sign that students are borrowing books for home reading.
- Dr Norbert Lobo suggested replacing the word 'gate entry' with a suitable substitute
- Fr Principal thanked the library staff and all the committee members for their active participation and suggestions. The meeting concluded at 5.15 pm.

Blood Donation Camp

The NSS Unit of St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru organized Blood Donation Camp in association with Wenlock District Hospital and Red Cross Society, Mangaluru on 8 August, 2018 in the College Auditorium. Dr Sharath, Medial Officer, District Wenlock Hos-



pital, Mangaluru was the Chief Guest. Mr Edward, Red Cross Society, Mangaluru was the guest of honour. Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ, Principal, St Aloysius College presided over the programme.

Chief Guest, Dr Sharath, in his address, briefed the audience on the importance of blood donation. He explained how the concept of Blood Donation came into existence. In the year 1941, blood donation camp was introduced in Karnataka and Sri Jawaharlal Nehru was the first person to donate blood. He also explained the various groups of blood and how to ascertain them. In India, a person above the age of 18 and below 65 can donate blood. In other countries, a person at the age of



15 can donate blood. A person whose weight is 45 – 50 Kgs is eligible to donate blood. Men can donate blood once in 3 months and women, once in 4 months. He narrated the purpose for which the collected units of blood is used.

A healthy person has 6 litres of blood in the body. But a person needs only 3 litres of blood for survival. Hence, any healthy person can donate blood and the donor can recover the blood within a short span of time. Donating blood also helps in discharging cholesterol stored in the heart and helps build immunity in the body.

Principal, Rev. Dr Praveen Martis, in his presidential address, highlighted the importance of donating blood to a needy patient. The intention of donating blood is to save one's life and it should be voluntary donation. He also appreciated the efforts taken by the NSS to conduct such camps for a noble cause.

Prof. Aranha brought out the salient aspects of the IBC


