International Seminar - The First World War: Indian Context

The Department of History organised an international Seminar titled **The First World War: Indian Context** on 5-6 January 2016 in LCRI air conditioned Auditorium in commemoration of the Centenary Year of the First World War (1914-1918).

The Seminar was inaugurated by veteran Air Force Officer **Air Marshal K C Cariappa**. Air Commodore C K Kumar, Air Officer Commanding of Air Force Station, Begumpet was the Guest of Honour who represented Indian Airforce in the Seminar. Rector of St Aloysius College institutions Fr Dionysius Vaz SJ presided over the function.



The Key note was delivered by **Prof. Kaushik Roy**, Guru Nanak Chair Professor, Jadavpur University, Kolkata and Global Fellow, Peace Research Institute Oslo (PRIO), Norway.

Thirty-six scholars presented various research papers on the Indian experience of the First World War which involved social, political, economic, psychological and literary studies.

Naval officers of Indian Naval Academy, Ezhimala represented in the seminar through their research papers.

International Symposium on Emerging Trends in Business and Challenges to Business Education

January 23, 2018 witnessed the First ever International Symposium in the department of MBA at AIMIT, St Aloysius College (Autonomous). The symposium re-



involved around the contesting issue of the challenges to Business education in a changing business world. Dr Frank Trocki from Harrisburg University and Dr Marylou DeWald from Ottawa University who were the guest of honor inaugurated the symposium along with Rev. Fr Dionysius Vaz SJ, Rector – St Aloysius Institutions, Rev. Fr Denzil Lobo SJ, Director, AIMIT, Dr Row-



ena Wright, Dean – MBA and Mr Rayan D'Souza, Convener. In his message, Fr Denzil dwelt on the complexity of the world we live in and shed light on the need to think ahead of our times. In his presidential address, Fr Vaz exhorted the young minds, to make the least, the last and the lost a part of their decision making rather than just profits. He insisted on the ethics of the business decisions that are responsible for the kind of future we create.

The expert panel discussion that followed the inaugural saw diverse idea on the theme – Changing face of business education as a response to the VUCA world. Dr. T Mallikarjunappa, School of Management, Mangalore University who chaired the panel discussion provided a brief outlook of the VUCA concept from civil war to business today, highlighting the challenge for business education to stay abreast with the chaotic times. The members of the expert panel – Dr Frank Trocki (Harrisburg University, US), Dr Marylou DeWald (Ottawa University, US), Dr Raveendranath Nayak (Manipal School of

Management, Manipal) and Dr Aloysius Sequeira (NITK, Surathkal) – weaved the discussion knitting strands of technology, story telling, chaotic markets, innovation, research, critical thinking and need for managers to be trained emotionally. They touched on varied facets of VUCA adding another C (chaos) to volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity. The need for learner in a business school to go beyond the curriculum into taking courses online, to collaborating with partner school to share knowledge was put forward. The speakers while responding the enthusiastic audience asserted that we need to put people before profits, motivation before machines and creativity before cost.

The student panel discussion in the afterhours of lunch, brought on table challenges to business education from the learner themselves. Mr Ravi Kudtarkar, Faculty Member, MBA, AIMIT chaired the session and guided the discussion. Mr Jestin Joseph, Mr Rahul Udyavar, Ms Fency, Ms Kriti Nahata and Ms Deeksha Pemmaiah (students of MBA) presented their concerns and comments on need for business education to move from rote learning to right learning. They touched upon the curriculum, system of teaching and evaluation, hands-on-experiential learning and reiterated the pressing need for business education to become dynamic to stay ahead of markets. Dr Rowena Wright, Dean – MBA gave away the mementos and certificates of participation. Ms Reeshal Fernandes and Mr Ashil Abdullah compered the event.

Media Manthan - 2018

Nurture contentment and humanism: Justice Hegde tells budding scribes Contentment and humanism are the two important values that media practitioners must nurture in a neo-liberal democracy, N. Santosh Hegde, former judge of the Supreme Court has said.

He was speaking after inaugurating the national conference on the theme, ‘Media in a neo-liberal democracy: Many challenges’ organised by the department of Journalism and Mass Communication, St Aloysius College (Autonomous), here on Tuesday.

“We cannot have exaggerated expectations about media. Media are as good as society we live in. This is because, just like other three estates of democracy, the fourth estate the media emerges from civil society. It is when society becomes responsible, ethical and upholds human values that we can expect the same from all institutions of democracy,” Justice Hegde said.

Speaking about compromising of ethics and allegations of corruption against certain sections of media, he said



that when one becomes too greedy all principles and ethics are forgotten. “There was a case when a person was dying in an accident on the road and was begging for water, people were clicking photos and uploading them on social media. I do not think we must stoop to such inhuman levels,” Justice Hegde remarked.

Calling upon journalism students to not give up humanity even as they pursue their career, Justice Hedge said that it is only through genuine humanity that this world would be a better place.

Rector of St Aloysius Institutions, Fr Dionysius Vas, Principal Dr (Fr) Praveen Martis and HOD of Mass Communication department Dr (Fr) Melwyn Pinto were present.

Talk on Rawls theory of Justice in Indian Context

The Department of political science organized a talk "Rawl's Theory of Justice in the Indian context" at 2.40pm on 04th January 2018 at Sanidhya by Ms Shaunna Rodrigues Teaching fellow and Ph.D. student Department of Middle East, South Asian and African Studies, Columbia University.

Miss Shaunna Rodrigues ran through the text of John Rawls, "A Theory of Justice" by contextualizing to the Indian experiences. A **Theory of Justice** is a work of political philosophy and ethics by John **Rawls**, in which the author attempts to solve the problem of distributive **justice** (the socially just distribution of goods in a society) by utilising a variant of the familiar device of the social contract. Rawls theory of justice revolves around the adaptation of two fundamental principles of justice which would, in turn, guarantee a just and morally acceptable society. The first principle guarantees



the right of each person to have the most extensive basic liberty compatible with the liberty of others. The second principle states that social and economic positions are to be a) to everyone's advantage and b) open to all.

Ms Rodrigues explained the 'original position' and 'veil of ignorance' by utilizing day-to-day examples to create a hypothetical scenario. From the original position she explained the two principles of justice: the 'liberty principle'; and 'fair equality of opportunity' balanced with the 'difference principle'. These principles in turn would apply to the basic structure of social institutions. The talk also brought in his corollary work, "Political Liberalism". Students contextualized their queries to the cases of Kanhaiya Kumar Kumar of JNU or Bhima Koregaon. She pointed that liberalism is challenged from various quarters—history, colonial state, upholding one's religious ideals, nationalism, etc.

Guest Lecture

Dept. of MCA had conducted a Technical talk on 25th Jan 2018, at AIMIT Auditorium. Program Started at 2:00 PM. Dr Santhosh B welcomed and introduced the resource person Dr Ezz-El-Din Hemdan. There were two sessions on two different but related topics. First session was on "Ethical Hacking and Penetration testing" which explained about ethical hacking, issues in hacking and penetration techniques, tools available, careers in ethical hacking and demonstrated some live examples of hacking techniques. Second session was on "Cloud forensics" which presented the need of cloud forensics, how it is different from internet forensics, various possible methods of forensics analysis. The speaker also pointed that not many work has been done on this field and this could be taken up as a topic for more exploration and research.



The program was attended by the first year students of MCA and MSc(ST).

The Management Development Center at AIMIT commenced the New Year with a 2 day MDP on January 5-6, 2018 on "Building Ethical and Moral Leadership".



The program was anchored by Fr Oswald Mascarenhas S.J. JRD Tata Chair Professor of Corporate Ethics at XLRI, Jamshedpur. Participants were senior managers from Syndicate Bank, Karnataka Bank, Corporation Bank and Tata Consultancy Services.

Mr Allen Pereira, ex. Chairman and Managing Director, Bank of Maharashtra and Mr Aloysius Albuquerque, Chairman and Managing Director of M/s. Albuquerque Hotels Pvt. Ltd., which owns the Summer Sands Beach Resort shared their experience with the participants.

Fr Denzil Lobo S.J. inaugurated the program with a quote from the Bhagvat Gita

Fr Mascarenhas pointed out that true leaders find meaning in their lives and are able to communicate this meaning effectively to their followers. In the turbulent



markets of today, he emphasized it is very important for leaders to examine their decisions using the LEMS lens (Legal, Ethical, Moral and Spiritual) for building Sustained Competitive Advantage. In the spiritual context, he brought in a connect to the Hindu doctrine of Dharma. The sessions were lively with discussions using the LEMS lens on current cases of boardroom turbulence including the Vishal Sikka vs Narayan Murthy, Cyrus Mistry vs Ratan Tata and lives of great leaders like Gandhi and Fidel Castro. He concluded the program highlighting Human Dignity as the foundation of all

corporate leadership.

Mr Allen Pereira shared his experience of making decisions ethically under political and other pressures and being able to face the consequences. He highlighted that good leaders must have the courage to face the consequences of standing by their ethical decisions. Mr. Aloysius Albuquerque shared the ups and downs of his entrepreneurial journey where his strong faith in God saw him through the hardest times of this journey, making a strong case for the need of a spiritual anchor for an ethical entrepreneur.

HACCP level 3 certificate Training programme

“Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP), it is a management system in which Food Safety is addressed through the analysis and the control of biological, chemical and physical hazards from raw material production, procurement and handling to manufacturing, distribution and consumption of the final product”

Industries required HACCP trained people for the analysis of hazards in their production and also to facilitate the students for developing skill of hazard analysis. On behalf of St Aloysius College, Mangalore; Dept. of Food Science and Technology had organized HACCP level 3 certificate programme for 3 days at college (Arrupe Auditorium), from 4th to 6th January 2018. Training programme was conducted by Dr Anandavally, FAO/UN Safety Expert, Managing Director, Food Safety Solutions International, Cochin and TR Ananthanarayanan General Manager, Food Safety Solutions International, Cochin.

The training programme was inaugurated by welcome speech by the staff Coordinator Ms Shilpa and lighting the lamp and vote of Thanks by the HOD of the Department Dr Raghavendra

In the first session introduction to food safety, GMP (Good Manufacturing Practice), PRPs and other related topics were discussed. Students were provided study material of HACCP principles and some activity sheets. The students were divided into 7 groups and they were told to write



SSOP for a product. The session ended up in the evening with four HACCP steps.

On the second day in the first session the HACCP principles and its industrial application were discussed with suitable examples in the second session all the groups were told to select a product and make HACCP plan for the selected product. Three groups presented on that day, and the discussions, corrections about that were made after each presentation and the session ended with this.

On the third day remaining groups presented their products and HACCP plan, the rest HACCP principles were explained and discussed. After that taking fishery industry as an example a video was shown about the hygiene and the maintenance of quality; especially GMPs. The important points in that video were told by all the groups.

An exam was conducted based on the three days training programme. It was conducted to qualify the students for HACCP level 3. At the end students shared their experiences. Prizes were distributed to the best performing groups. In total it was a very educative training programme which will help to develop their skills in food safety and it is one of the criteria for Food Industry

The certified body were from QCI (Quality Council of India) accredited.

He pointed the rationale for holding the examinations in various stages and the importance of each paper. Particularly he laid emphasis on the Mains paper on *Ethics, integrity and aptitude* which becomes essential as an aspirant is not guided by any syllabus but by values and principles that she or he have built their lives on.

Agenda 1: Deemed University Proposal

Agenda 2: Research Centre/Research work/Seminars/conferences

The college is hopeful of getting approval as Research Centres for departments of English and Chemistry. Regarding Research policy of the college, principal said that it has been received well by the staff. He said that staff must apply for minor and major research project. Management staff can also apply for FIP leave to do their PhD work. Fr mentioned that International seminar organized by History department went on well. the last exam date **c)** Raise the cut off marks for distinction (separate for Humanities and science) **d)** External Valuation must be done first **e)** Change the examiners every year (expand the list) **f)** Questions framed should also be analytical type particularly for humanities **g)** Basic Sciences practical time table to be given in advance **h)** Practical Examination and Valuation must not be done together **i)** Two days DA should not be given on one day **j)** Payment to externals will be done only through NEFT **k)** Valuation to be done as early as possible, can send papers for valuation to valuers **l)** Refreshments to be brought from our canteen only.

Agenda 7: Research Culture:

Principal said teachers must come together and share their Research work, Even students can join. Once a month this can be held for Science and Humanities separately. Dr Suresh poojary and Melissa from Humanities and Dr Shashi and Dr Chandrasekhar from Science Stream were chosen as Volunteers to coordinate this activity.

Agenda 8: Website:

Principal mentioned that New website is almost ready and will be launched soon. Those departments who have not given adequate information should do so immediately.

Agenda 9: Project work:

Department heads were asked to coordinate the Project work of students which they begin from third semester onwards and to ensure that they submit within the stipulated time.

Agenda 10: Placements:

Placement officer Ms kavitha said that Placements is low this time. Companies approach but asking to hold on. There was suggestion to link placement with foreign collaboration. Also to encourage students to apply for government jobs. Registrar mentioned that if any former Students who want syllabus copy can obtain from PG office by paying Rs 150 and with HOD's signature and seal of college on every page. Every department must also have a copy of all syllabuses from their year of establishment.

Agenda 11: Admissions:

Principal mentioned that this time PG admissions were lower compared to UG and we need to plan strategy to improve the admissions. He said that we would be having online admissions from this year onwards and the process would start soon. He informed that Maths Department would be shifted to LCRI to accommodate MCom Finance and accounting batch in the next academic year. IN the background of media coming under scrutiny in its role in disseminating factual information, post graduate department of Journalism and Mass Communication, St Aloysius College (SAC) organised a daylong conference on the topic, 'Media in a neo-liberal democracy: many challenges', here on Tuesday.

Former Karnataka Lokayukta Justice N Santosh Hegde addressing the gathering after inaugurating the conference on the topic, 'Media in a neo-liberal democracy: many challenges', at LCRI block in St Aloysius college said while society was becoming intolerant, media was slowly becoming corrupt. The corruption was not fault of an individual but of the society. The society expects truth and facts from media, but somewhere, even media is involved in creating conflict among people, he rued.

Justice Santosh Hegde said: "We need to focus on two important aspects in life which are contentment and humanism. We have long forgotten the footsteps of our forefathers." He highlighted on different aspects of laws including sedition, defamation and freedom of expression. With every passing day, human values are declining in society and media. "The voice of poor, exploited and suppressed should always be upheld," he


