NATIONAL SEMINAR ON CONSUMER PROTECTION - ISSUES AND CHALLENGES

Two Days of National Seminar on Consumer Protection – Issues and Challenges was organized by the Faculty of Commerce, St Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru in collaboration with Centre for Consumer Studies (CCS), Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), New Delhi, in Eric Mathias Hall, on February 16 – 17, 2018. Dr. Suresh Poojary, Dean, Faculty of Commerce, welcomed the gathering and introduced the re-



source persons and dignitaries of the day. The key note address was delivered by the Chief Guest, Dr. Ravindranath Shanbhag, President, Human Rights Protection Foundation, Udupi, who is a pioneer in the consumer protection movement for over four decades, even prior to the enactment of the Consumer Protection Act of 1986. In his address he stressed on the definition of the word “consumer” and the difference between the words “customer” and “consumer”. He vividly presented how he fought a series of cases on violation of consumer rights and human rights and brought relief to the victims, in this region of our country. He also highlighted the fact of human rights violation that happens in prisons and other government offices.

The Guest of Honour, Dr. Suresh Misra, Chair Professor and Chairman, Centre for Consumer Studies, Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), New Delhi, in his address mentioned that the Consumer Forum is a government funded body, which receives only 30% of financial aid, and the rest is raised by the Forum. He also expressed his concern that the recent study indicates that only 15% of our country’s population was aware of the Consumer Protection Act, and the rights of the consumer. He said that there are many Issues concerned with the Consumer Protection but the Challenges are much more, especially in the field of E-commerce, where maximum complaints are registered. He was also the resource person for two sessions – Consumer Protection and Empowerment, and Misleading Advertisements and Consumer. The President of the program and the Principal of St. Aloysius College (Autonomous) Dr. Praveen Martis S.J., in his presidential address remarked that, students should actively participate in the consumer protection movement and know the nuances in the process of getting redressed. He also voiced his concern on the role of humans in the wake of Artificial Intelligence revolution and the protection of the human rights.

Dr. Manuel Tauro, the Convener of the National Seminar, expressed his gratitude to all those who were involved in organizing the event. Mrs. Jenifer Quadros was the master of the ceremony. Dr. Sapna Chadah,

Faculty of Constitutional and Administrative law, CCS, IIPA spoke on Medical Services and Consumer, and Legal Framework in respect of Consumer Protection. Shri Nimesh Shetty, Advocate gave his views on issues relating to Financial Services and Consumer. The Session on e-Commerce, Cyber Security and Consumer by Shri Savitra Tej from the City Cyber Crime Police Station, Mangaluru enlightened the participants on precautions to be taken while using internet and digital services. The session was chaired by Prof. Santhosh Rebello from AIMIT, St Aloysius College, Beeri Campus. The session on Food Safety and Consumer was engaged by Shri Nagesh Pai, former President, Canara Chamber of Commerce and Industries, Mangaluru.

Around 200 participants were present which included teachers, students, researchers, goods and service providers, trainers and NGOs. Co-convener of the Seminar Mrs. Caroleena Janefer meticulously scheduled presentation of papers by the participants. About 90 papers on the various aspects of the theme of the seminar, were presented in four venues over two days. Her insights on overcoming the hurdles faced by potential Entrepreneurs with practical ideas served as a good start for a productive day. The main focus was on how to be successful entrepreneurs, establish their own rules and succeed even if they fall a couple of times in this life long journey. She spoke about the 'Centre for Entrepreneurship and Learning' and its pros for a budding entrepreneur.

Fr Denzil Lobo S.J, Director, AIMIT delivered the Presidential address emphasizing on the passion for carrying out a business. He portrayed the journey of a passion which turns into an obsession and an idea becoming a reality. He put forth an example of a bunch of entrepreneurial personalities who strove towards becoming successful and concluded with Elon Musk's famous quote, "Work super hard".

The Certificates of the online course on Entrepreneurship from Santa Clara University, California were handed over to the student coordinators Rahul Udyawar, Prajwal Sequeira, Hasna and Aisiri by Mrs. Vathika Pai. Two hundred and twenty seven students completed this MOOC course.

Rahul Udyawar, student coordinator welcomed the gathering while Hasna Veeran, student coordinator proposed the vote of thanks. Dr Rowena Wright, Dean- Academics, Swapna Rose, Faculty Coordinator were also present. Aisiri and Prajwal anchored the inaugural.

There were four sessions conducted and the first session was addressed by Annappa Pai, who is the director of ACE Foods Pvt. Ltd. He focused on his journey as an entrepreneur. His business of manufacturing started due to the non-availability of tasty potato chips in the city as compared to Mumbai. The idea of becoming an entrepreneur gained momentum while travelling to explore various possibilities to start a new business. He stressed on the importance of analyzing before acting. His suggestions to young entrepreneurs were to focus on the product, quality and customer rather than the money. He also said it would be useful to learn new languages to communicate to the suppliers, dealers, service providers

and customers. Success doesn't happen overnight is what he concluded his session with.

The second speaker for the day was CA Chandrakanth Rao who spoke on the formalities of starting a new business with utmost emphasis laid on financial management and allocation of monetary resources. He spoke on the importance of never giving up when one decides to start a new business. He spoke on the relevance of a good business plan/ framework prior to starting a business. Speaking about the financial aspect of business, he explained about the sources of funds, forms of funds which vary from business to business and also the mobilization of funds. He guided the budding entrepreneurs on what they need to focus on when it comes to the financial planning of a business. He threw some light on how the funds would appear in the Profit and Loss statement, how to present the project report while seeking funds from a bank. He also shared important information on the legal aspects and compliance factors while starting a business.

The third session in the afternoon was addressed by Mr K Nikesh Shetty, an Advocate. He gave us a list of steps to be followed before starting a business. He spoke about the importance of the certificate of incorporation and the legal consequences that an entrepreneur will have to face if he/she fails to abide to the legal rules and regulations. He also gave us a set of legal Acts related to Labour legislation and concluded with a brief note on Intellectual Property Rights.

The last session was taken over by Mr Rajendra Desai,



an in-house Resource person who spoke about the relevance of marketing in connection with a budding entrepreneur.

He spoke about his experience as an entrepreneur in the past. The challenges and pros of self-employment. His main focus was on doing things in a better way. With good marketing, sales become irrelevant, and this was best explained by Mr Desai taking the example of iPhone. It was a very interactive session. Student entrepreneurs from amongst the Aloysians were picked up, Mr Prajwal Sequeira, Mr. Calvin D'Cunha, Mr Sada Muneeb and Mr Hameed Nadeem shared their entrepreneurial journey, as a Web-designer, an Event Manager, a Tissue manufacturer and an Interior designer respectively. Sometimes examples from amongst us will help us understand Entrepreneurial Development better.

On the whole the workshop paved a path to be more informative, interactive and gave students full-fledged insights to become successful entrepreneurs.

(Autonomous), spoke of the state of agriculture in India after the budget 2018, some of its new initiatives and the budget allocated for its improvement. The final panelist, Mr Norbert Morris Shenoy, Managing Director, Aunanjali Securities, spoke about the budget overall, focusing on all aspects including finance. "The budget kills the golden goose to make omlets," he said. He stated that the budget is long on vision but short on action. However, he concluded that he is happy with the budget, and said, "At this point of time where the government is going through difficulties in implementation of GST, the budget does justice." The panel was then open to questions from the audience.

The moderator Dr Norbert Lobo concluded the discussion by saying, "Our purpose is fulfilled". Reji P John, staff convener thanked the panelists and audience. The Programme was attended by a large number of students and faculty members.



Biotechnology Skill Enhancement Programme at St Aloysius

MANGALURU, DHNS: St Aloysius College has been selected for the second phase of programme renamed as 'Biotechnology Skill Enhancement Programme' on Fermentation and Bio-processing. Interested students can apply.

St Aloysius College Principal Fr Dr Praveen Martis said that the Biotechnology Finishing School (BTFS) is a programme supported by the Government of Karnataka's Department of IT, BT and Science and Technology. The objective of the programme is to provide industry specific skills to students.

The Department of Post Graduate Studies and Research in Biotechnology of the college provides opportunities in the field of fermentation and bio-processing domain. The students will be trained on fermentation, upstream and downstream processing, production/manufacturing, quality control/quality assurance and facility management and applications of fermentation. Regulatory requirements of different countries and CGMP requirements for the production area of bio-pharmaceuticals will also be covered.

Mangaluru chapter to document Guttu houses

The Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH) has taken up the restoration of old paintings at St. Aloysius Chapel in the city since a month, according to its chairman Major Gen. L.V. Gupta (retd).

Addressing a gathering after inaugurating the Mangaluru chapter of the INTACH here on Thursday, he said: "We are glad that the church has invested in this work. Please do visit the chapel and see the laboratory set up for restoration work."

Stressing the need to protect and conserve heritage monuments and structures, he said that no country can be great without its heritage.

Mr. Gupta said that largely people are ignorant of India's diverse history and heritage.

"Only 7,500 monuments have so far been declared as protected monuments. As per an estimate by INTACH, there are five million heritage sites in the country. Many of these monuments and structures are unprotected. They were being destroyed for lack of awareness of heritage value of these monuments," he said.

He said the INTACH was working on listing and documentation of heritage structures and monuments and asking the government and people to protect them.

Subash Basu, convener of INTACH Mangaluru chapter, said that the chapter will document old Guttu houses and also visit houses of fishermen and artisans to document the way they build their houses.

They will work to revive some traditional methods of building houses that includes use of mud, timber and lime for construction.

Volunteers lay metal road cones at Mahakalipadpu

MANGALURU: The areas in and around Mahakalipadpu got a new look after over 250 volunteers carried out a cleanliness drive on Sunday.

The drive was carried out as a part of the Ramakrishna Mission's Swachhata Abhiyan.

Degree students groom slum kids for exams

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Mangaluru: Forty-five children from a slum in Mannagudde will go into the exams confident and well prepared, thanks to a few graduate students of St Aloysius College. For the degree students, it began as part of a college project where they had to invest 20 hours for a social cause. But, they decided to spend four months teaching slum kids at the Gurudhwara slum community. The project began mid-November and continued till February. The concept was chalked out by the Centre for Social Concern (CSC), an extension activity of the college. "Every degree student has to participate in SAHAYA and



The students teach the kids basic maths, science and English post-graduate students in an outreach programme as part of their academic work. SAHAYA involves 20 hours of work. The CSC decided to use this time to reach out to slum kids. The BSc and BA students took keen interest in it," said CS coordinator K Gopika. "Students visited the slums every alternate day and spent at least two hours a day with kids there. The objective was to create interest in education, get the basics right and also create awareness among parents. We believe this has worked," Gopika said.

Apart from teaching basic maths, science and English, the students also provided the kids stationery. Gopika said 150 families stay in the slum. "They are migrants from North Karnataka districts such as Vijayapura, Bagalkote and Raichur and most are daily wage workers. Their children don't go to school. Also, they'd miss classes for weeks when they travelled back home with their parents. Our students helped them revise the syllabi before the exam," she said, adding that the parents' attitude to schooling, too, has improved. Teachers at the government school in Mannagudde, where most of these kids study, say they are better focused and the attitude of parents has changed for the better.
