National symposium - Redefining Corporate Social Responsibility in an Era of Judicial Activism

January 11, 2019, The Department of MBA organized a one day National symposium on Redefining Corporate Social Responsibility in an Era of Judicial Activism. The distinguished speakers included; Dr Rengarajan Chief Guest, GM, Legal, Toyota Kirloskar Motor; Mr. Rahul Maroli the Vice-President at Ola and Ms. Rudra Radhakrishnan, Sales head PepsiCo. There is significant confusion in the private sector, the public sector, and civil society as to the meaning of Corporate Social Responsibility (or CSR, as it is widely known). Perhaps because the concept has evolved from philanthropy, many continue to make it synonymous with philanthropy. The convenience of the acronym has a lot of interested parties discussing CSR as if it were a universal, uniform, well-defined, standard concept. Every party has its own



definition, many times unarticulated, which is used to advance or detract from the concept. This failure in communication has led to significant controversy and confusion, even polarizing positions. This is not to say that the discrepancies between many parties are not real, but these discrepancies are exacerbated by the lack of an explicit understanding regarding which of the many ideas embodied in the acronym "CSR" the parties are talking about

The terms "social" and "responsibility" are also often misinterpreted. For some, "social" refers to social issues such as health, education, security and the like-issues generally under the responsibility of governments. Others more correctly define "social" as a reference to society, including the planet and the environment, i.e. the ambit of action of the corporation.

For some, "responsibility" stands for accountability for the corporation's actions; for others, a sense of duty toward society; and for others, good judgment (as represented in the Golden Rule, "Do unto others as you would like done unto you").

In terms of what actions are included, most people interpret these terms to mean that the corporation has a responsibility toward society, and that the corporation has a responsibility to do something about the problems that affect society; others interpret them to mean that the corporation must take responsibility for its own activities as they affect society. These views have very different implications.

In the first case, the corporation is attributed responsibilities that go beyond the purpose for which it was created, such as becoming involved in the welfare of the population (thereby addressing some of the failures of government). Many of these activities are the

responsibility of the citizens themselves and of their local or national governments. Needless to say, most representatives of the private sector do not agree that these are the functions of the corporation and reject the whole concept of CSR. In the second case, the corporation as a legal "person" is responsible for the impact of its activities, and these activities must be carried out with respect toward those affected.

Corporate Social Responsibility" means the corporation must be responsible toward society and the environment for the impact of its actions. This is not to say that the case is closed. There is significant divergence as to what being responsible for the impact of one's actions means. The concept of what constitutes responsible behavior changes from context to context, from culture to culture and, within context and culture, changes over time.

The three distinguished resource persons spoke of all this and more in the context of their respective organizations.

Students enjoyed a day of meaningful learning and the day ended with a lively question and answer session.

Thus both the benefactor and beneficiary, blossom together in the very act, in the very gesture and in the resulting process of such mutual interaction. It is a unique project towards the heart-education of our students. This year we had embarked on an innovative and very unique event called Kalarava 2019 - a two-day state level interschool Cricket & cultural fest for the Visually Impaired on January 13-14, 2019.



The event aimed to bring together the talented Visually Impaired students from the entire state and provide them a platform to display their talents in various performing arts and display their cricket skills.

The special attractions of this year’s Kalarava were the Cricket Tournament, Variety Entertainment, Mimicry and Quiz competitions for the visually impaired children. The event was inaugurated by Padmashree Shekhar Naik, former Captain of the Indian National Cricket Team of the Blind and Rev. Fr Dionysius Vaz SJ, Rector of St Aloysius Institutions was the president of the function. Sri Mahantesh G K, Founder & Chairman of Samarathanam International, President of World Blind Cricket Ltd. 

Book release of "Gandhi: The soul force warrior", authored by Ambassador (retd) Pascal Alan Nazareth

St. Aloysius College (Autonomous) Mangaluru and the Catholic Association of South Kanara (CASK) organised the book release of "Gandhi: The soul force warrior",



authored by Ambassador (retd) Pascal Alan Nazareth on January 18, 2019 at Eric Mathias Hall. Amb. Nazareth is a renowned Gandhian writer and a recipient of the U Thant Peace Award by the Sri Chinmoy Peace Meditation Group at the United Nations, for his 'Life Time of Dedication and World Service by promoting of the Gandhian Values of Truth, Non Violence, Communal Harmony and Humanitarian Service'. He shares this prestigious award with world peace lead-



ers like Pope John Paul II, The Dalai Lama, Mother Theresa, Mikhail Gorbachev, Nelson Mandela and Desmond Tutu. This is his second book on Gandhi, the first being his widely acclaimed book 'Gandhi's Outstanding Leadership', also released at his alma mater the St. Aloysius College.

Mrs. Giselle Mehta, the author of 'Blossom Showers', former IRS officer and a promoter of veganism gave an eloquent review-cum-overview of the released book. She pointed that the book brought out the soul force of Gandhi wherein he could shake the British Empire through a revolution unlike the ones never seen elsewhere.

Amb. Nazareth explained to the audience his ambitious choice of calling Gandhi a "soul force warrior" while comparing the revolutions that had taken around the world. Gandhi was able to answer the oppressor (the British) with his simple yet original and powerful techniques of truth and non-violence that relied on spirituality for which the British had no answer. Gandhi revolutionised the concept of 'revolution' and spiritualised it.

Dr. Charles Lobo, the Chief Postmaster General of

Karnataka Circle recommended the book to students, peace lovers as an answer for the uneasy phase that modern India faces. Rev. Fr. Dionysius Vaz, the Rector of Aloysian institutions gave his presidential address in which he appreciated the works of Amb. Nazareth and drew the attention of the audience to remember Gandhi's talisman, "Whenever you are in doubt, or when the self becomes too much in you, apply the following test. Recall the face of the poorest and the weakest man [woman] whom you may have seen, and ask yourself, if the step you contemplate is going to be of any use to him [her]. Will he [she] gain anything by it? Will it restore him [her] to a control over his [her] own life and destiny? In other words, will it lead to swaraj [freedom] for the hungry and spiritually starving millions? Then you will find your doubts and your self melt away."

The Principal of the College, Rev. Dr. Praveen Martis welcomed and introduced the dignitaries. Dr. Derek Lobo, representative of CASK introduced Amb. Nazareth and Dr. Rose Veera D'Souza thanked the gathering.

Public Lecture on "Achievements of the Republic of India and Challenges Ahead "

As a part of the Constitution Week 2019 which was observed from 21st to 26th January 2019, a public lecture on "Achievements of the Republic of India and Challenges Ahead" by Justice H.N Nagamohan Das, Former



Judge of the Karnataka High Court, Bengaluru was held on 23.01.2019 at 3.00pm in the LF Rasquinha Hall, St. Aloysius College (Autonomous), Mangaluru. Mr. Nagamohan Das is also the author of a Kannada book "Samvidhana Oodu".

Dr. Vishanz Pinto Dean of the Faculty of Arts was the Convener. The program was compered by Ms. Aarti Shanbague, Head of the BBM Department. Ms. Vinaya Durga, lecturer, Department of BCA rendered the prayer song.

In his talk, Mr. Das elucidated in detail, the crucial changes, establishment of legislative, judicial and executive institutions after India became a Republic. He stated that before independence, India was a nation where more than 80% illiteracy prevailed and the enforcement of the constitution provided amenities to the larger public. He was proud to say that there were areas where India had topped the world.



Mr. Das condemned the evils of the caste system which are imposed upon the unwilling populace. He shed light upon the fact that there are a lot of drawbacks in the present society despite the tremendous achievements of the state; 20% of eligible youth have no access to education, heightened unemployment, corruption, cultural degeneration and growing criminal orientation. He pressed on the challenges that the nation as a whole is going through at the moment ; lack of constitutional

failure to link political, social and economic democracy, concentration of wealth and a lot more.

The areas of concern which were highlighted by Mr. Das included separation of religion from politics, the idea of welfare state, fundamentalism and the concept of privatization in the true sense. He requested the crowd to read, understand and imbibe the constitution and concluded his words with a quote by Rumi; "Love is a powerful weapon". The 40 min talk by Mr. Nagamohan Das was followed by a question and answer session.

Principal Rev. Dr. Praveen Martis SJ in his presidential address said that the Constitution of India continues to intrigue and inspire us even today. He emphasized the need to be vigilant in today's society. Mr. Anup Denzil Veigas, Department of English proposed the vote of thanks.

Gun Violence in the US

Lecture by Dr. Ute Ritz-Deutch on “Gun violence and/or police brutality in the US”, Sanidhya-SAC, January 5, 2018 at 11.00am

Dr. Ritz- Deutch is giving a series of lectures in Mangaluru on human rights. She addressed the students of Humanities at the St. Aloysius College (Autonomous) on



gun violence in the USA. She pointed out that less than half of the USA population owned 400 million guns that exceeded the population itself. In other words, USA has 5-6% of world’s population but owns 40% of its guns. Largely the victims are veterans, children, Afro-Americans and women. On an average 100 persons die every day due to gun violence in the USA; more than 60 are cases of suicide.

As possessing arms is a fundamental right and firearms regulations are done at the state level, a comprehensive law is absent. Second, given the lack of research in this area, the Congress is unable to come up with a comprehensive stringent law to regulate use of firearms. Third, efforts of lobby groups like the National Rifle Association have watered down any efforts in tackling the problem. Dr. Rose Veera D’Souza convened the program and Dr. Joyce Lobo thanked the gathering.

'Government, courts have equal power to end blind beliefs'
 Justice Nagamohan Das tells students at St Aloysius College

MANGALURU: The Supreme Court's judgement allowing women entry into the Sabarimala temple should not be viewed as interference with the affairs of temples, former judge of Karnataka High Court Justice H N Nagamohan Das has said.

The move is an attempt to end blind beliefs violating human dignity and contradicting fundamental rights, he stressed.

He was delivering a talk on 'Achievements of the Republic of India and the Challenges Ahead' on Wednesday, as a part of the Constitution Week organised by the Faculty of Arts at the L.F. Rasquinha Hall in St Aloysius College.

Devadasi, and Made Made Snana. Justice Das recollects landmark judgements, like on triple Talaa, in order to justify that such interference happened regarding other regions too and was not restricted to Hinduism. He also clarified Articles 25 to 30 in the Constitution did not contradict each other. "Every article has a purpose," he explained.

Re-interpretation
 The areas of concern highlighted by Justice Das included separation of religion from politics, the idea of welfare state and fundamentalism. "Many of the problems and challenges in society are not because of the Constitution. The fault lies in interpretation of the Constitution, which is not while-hearted and not in tune with the Indian ethos. Democracy needs to be re-interpreted in favour of the common man," he stressed.

Justice Das, who has authored a book in Kannada, called 'Samvidhana Odu', urged the students to read and understand the Constitution.

"If everyone were to live according to the Constitution, then the nation will flourish," he said.

St Aloysius College principal Fr Praveen Martis, who presided over the programme, said that the Constitution of India continues to intrigue and inspire us even today.

Vishnu Ramo, dean (Faculty of Arts), was present during the interaction.
